

How It Works:

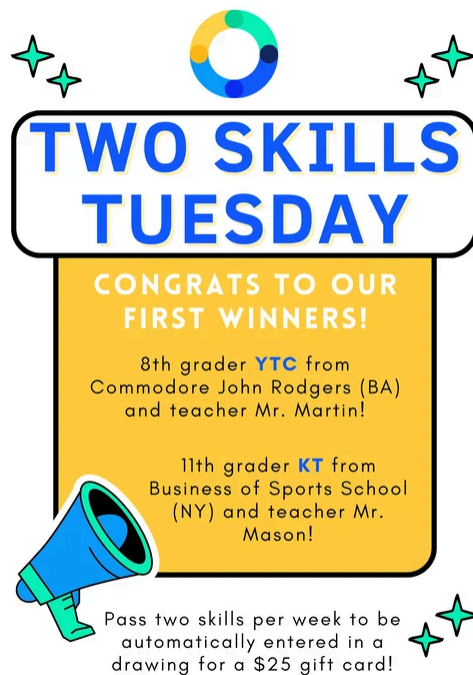
- Ensure your students are enrolled in a class with *Roadmaps*.
